



Dear Parents and Carers

Today is the final day of Term 1 here at The Geelong College. It has been a term full of surprises, some sadness, lots of uncertainty as well as plenty of success along the way.

I have written and spoken many times before about the importance of connections for people within The Geelong College. Our community comprises people from the present and the past, including students, parents as well as employees (teachers and support staff). In addition to strong connections to our local area we have important connections extending across the nation and the World. We are mindful of the economic impact upon our families and very concerned about them. The College Council will be giving consideration to ways of assisting families in these uncertain times. A number of strategies are currently under consideration. Communication about this will be distributed in due course. At this time, I would like to reassure everyone that The Geelong College will take its place as a responsible member of the wider community in addition to supporting our students to the maximum capacity available.

It is going to be an unusual Easter break this year. Travel restrictions and the prospect of greater restrictions on our movements are looming. With a little luck and through community compliance, they may not be necessary. At this moment we have to wait and see. I hope you have an opportunity to find balance and calm over the Easter break. There is certainly going to be lots of time spent with family.
